

## Tiger Moth Club of NZ 100 hour Technical Forum Report

A successful 3-day hands on 100Hr/Annual inspection was carried out on ZK-BAH over the long weekend of 24-26 September attended by Mat Grant, Gisborne, Ken Cowie, Dunedin and Kim Thompson, Auckland.

Club ambassador John Baynes made his Tiger available to be poked and prodded under the guidance of LAMEs Wayne Tantrum & Glenn Thompson at Thompson Aero Engineering at Taieri Airfield. John and Amanda Rutland delivered the Tiger to Taieri in typical fashion, via a four hour flight when a two hour flight would have sufficed. Glenn and Wayne provide tools, manuals and Moth experience

The aspiring Tiger engineers got to complete a routine 100Hr/Annual inspection of the Gipsy Major Engine and Tiger Airframe including Airworthiness Directive inspections, magneto change, pressure testing the induction manifold airbox, inspecting the magneto drive oil jet and filter, oil pressure adjustment, valve spring preload tests, correct assembly and torque of the prop hub to the crankshaft and propeller to the hub, inspecting an undercarriage shock strut internally and adjusting its preload. Prop Hub Lapping and blue check to crankshaft taper were also covered as well as the use of specialist tools

Various house of horror components were displayed and discussed especially valves, fuels and fuel system, oil and the differing Prop hub standards and modifications

Wayne (with Amanda) had to leave early to do a repair on an aircraft in Canterbury on his way home to Omaka and Mat also had to catch a flight to Gisborne. Wayne and John taught the troupe how to start a Tiger and Ken also got to complete a runup

After BAH was signed off, ambassador John gave Ken and Kim a short scenic flight around Dunedin with K & K each starting the Tiger. I think the TMCNZ has gained a couple of converts if the smiles were anything to go by

All involved had a very busy, educational and entertaining weekend. Wayne ensured that PC concepts were kept at bay. We also will likely organise another Training Forum at Omaka next year. 

Seen for the first time at a Tiger Moth Club event was the DH82C type undercarriage. Note the brakes and forward slant of the main gear. The rest of this Tiger Moth is, apart from the tailwheel, the same as any other Morris Motors Ltd built Tiger.

It is our understanding is that the registration letters ZK-ATM were reluctantly allocated by Civil Aviation because the original ZK-ATM is still active, although in Switzerland with the registration HB-UPM. In the unlikely event that the original ZK-ATM should return to New Zealand then the new incumbent will have to change its registration.



Neville Worsley has written an interesting account of his life flying all manner of aircraft many of them unusual. The bulk of the book is about his days as a topdressing pilot starting with a Piper Super Cub and later flying de Havilland Beavers and the mighty DC-3. It starts with his training on Tiger Moths and gives a particularly clear picture of just what it was like to be a topdressing pilot. Living in small towns, never sure whether it would be a stay at home day or a day practically glued to the controls from dawn to dusk. Yes there were plenty of adventures and they are described in this 220 page book. This is a most enjoyable book to read and backed up with lots of photos covering an era now sadly passed.



#### ZK-AQB IS FOR SALE

AQB (Serial #FM49) is one of 51 built by de Havilland Aircraft, Canada in1946 arriving in New Zealand in 1947. It was assembled and sold to the Auckland Aero Club embarking on an interesting flying history until 1972 when it crashed just off Motiti Island.

The wreckage changed hands a few times, finally ending up with Colin Smith and his team at the Croydon Aircraft Company, Mandeville where it was rebuilt it to it's present pristine standard. No expense was spared in bringing AQB up to a standard that could be considered the best in the world.

AQB is currently in the safe care of the Croydon Aviation Heritage Centre, Mandeville, New Zealand


