Since our annual Fly-In and AGM will be in Northland in 2026, it's time to go around the top of the country!

Itinerary

- **Saturday 28 February 2026 (Omaka):** We'll kick things off at Omaka with a great evening at one of our favourite Tiger-friendly airfields.
- **Sunday 1 March 2026 (Omaka → Foxpine → Waitotara Valley → Hawera):** Across the Strait with a fuel stop at Foxpine, then weather permitting we'll head to Waitotara Valley near



Whanganui, where frequent Tiger Camper Darren Luff built a strip many years ago. Mogas and a BBQ will be available onsite, plus a short drive to a woolshed with toilets. That evening we'll continue to Hawera, where Darren is close to completing the rebuild of Tiger Moth ZK-AIL.

- **Monday 2 March 2026 (Hawera → Te Kuiti → Tuakau → Whitianga):** Weather permitting, we'll fly around the mountain first thing before stopping at Te Kuiti for a BBQ lunch. Then we'll call in at a strip or two before the short hop over the estuary and the hills into "Whiti city" for the first of a two-night stopover.
- **Tuesday 3 March 2026 (Whitianga):** There are options aplenty for the day - boating, resting, or for the more adventurous a jaunt around the Coromandel Peninsula and across to Great Barrier for lunch or down the coast to Pauanui and Waihi Beach for lunch.
- **Wednesday 4 March 2026 (Whitianga → Kerikeri):** the weather will determine our route north to Kerikeri and whether we go east coast or west. There are a few strips to visit along the way for those who are keen.
- **Thursday 5 March 2026 (Kerikeri → Cape Reinga & Ninety Mile Beach → Kaitaia → Kerikeri):** From Kerikeri we'll fly up to North Cape, along the top of the country to Cape Reinga, then south along Ninety Mile Beach to Kaitaia before returning to Kerikeri for the night.
- **Friday 6 March 2026 (Kerikeri → Kaipara Flats):** Tiger Camp concludes as we head south to Kaipara Flats for the annual Fly-In and AGM weekend.

Please note that while overnight stops have now been finalised, all stopovers in between are subject to change.

If you're interested in joining, please complete the registration form to receive further information. This is not a commitment to attend, but simply an expression of interest so you receive all communications. Future updates will only go to those who have registered. Numbers will be confirmed in February.
